6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

MISSION & VISION:

The institution is committed to a vision shaped by its history and all the stakeholders sharing the vision make a concerted effort to translate it into its mission, objectives, and goals.

Vision:

- a) To empower students from all sections of society through holistic education centering on academic and non-academic engagements.
- b) To instill in our students moral values, discipline, and a broader humanistic commitment.
- c) To nurture and extend the legacy of the college – its commitment to education and society.

Mission:

- a) To impart quality education to students from backward classes and first generation learners from economically challenged backgrounds, thereby encouraging inclusive growth.
- b) To provide an ambience that promotes students' moral strength and professional competence, contributing to a healthy and prosperous society.
- c) To optimize the available infrastructure for sustained development of the college.
- d) To supplement and enrich the existing curriculum by means that look beyond the established one.
- e) To encourage a culture of participation for all the stakeholders that finally results in a collective team spirit.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

The institution has highly disciplined management system. The Principal, head of the institution reports the governing body about the important decisions taken by IQAC and different committees and subcommittees and cells which are formed by Teachers' Council in regular meeting. The Head of the Department are responsible for assessment of departmental activities.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- **For Under graduate studies:** The institution implements the curricula set by University. The syllabi are oriented periodically by the UG-BOS of University of Calcutta. In different workshops, faculties expressed their suggestions regarding syllabus. One faculty is member of UG-BOS of the affiliating university.
- **For Post graduate study:** The institution has one self financed Post Graduate department, the curricula of which are oriented by the members of PG-BOS following the guidelines of the affiliating university. Among the PG-BOS members, seven PG-BOS members are our faculty members of this institution. Student progression records suggest that the exercise had been beneficial to the students.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Class routine prepared by routine subcommittee.
- Academic calendar is prepared by IQAC. It is provided to all students during their orientation for the new session.
- Improvement of Laboratories: Improvement of Science Laboratories, Improvement of Classrooms with ICT facilities.
- Improvement of library: The resources of library have been enriched day by day. The reading, lending and cataloguing process are well organised. The library has been partially digitalised and INFLIBNET has been introduced.
- Improvement of Departmental libraries: The institution also maintains a dual library system and up-to-date resources help the teaching-learning process.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

For Under Graduate Studies:

- The students are evaluated through a continuous annual evaluative system over three years of UG study referred to as 1+1+1 system.
- Periodical Mid-Term test, class tests and Test Examinations are the part of the college curricula which is in conformity with the Examination pattern of the University of Calcutta
- Project works on environmental studies are the integral parts of the curricula for all the students in final year of their study and these projects are guided and evaluated by the members of faculty.
- College holds the university examinations, both theory and practical.

For Post Graduate studies:

- Students are evaluated through a semester of six month over two years. There is a summer project and seminar presentation.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Function of research committee:

- To review the Research Project Proposals prepared by the College faculty members for submission to funding bodies.
- To circulate the information on projects awards, timelines etc.
- To maintain the infra structural facilities of “Common Research Facility Centre” of the college for promoting research work.
- There is a research policy of our institution and this research policy has been proposed by this committee. By this policy our institution can sponsor interested student for research.

2. Career Counselling by our college

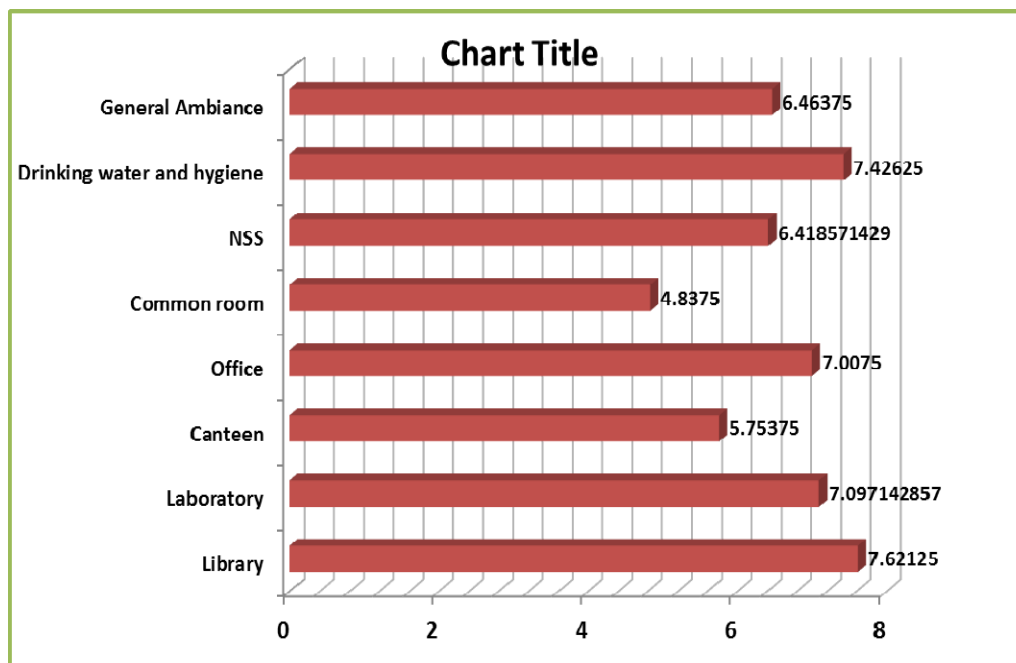
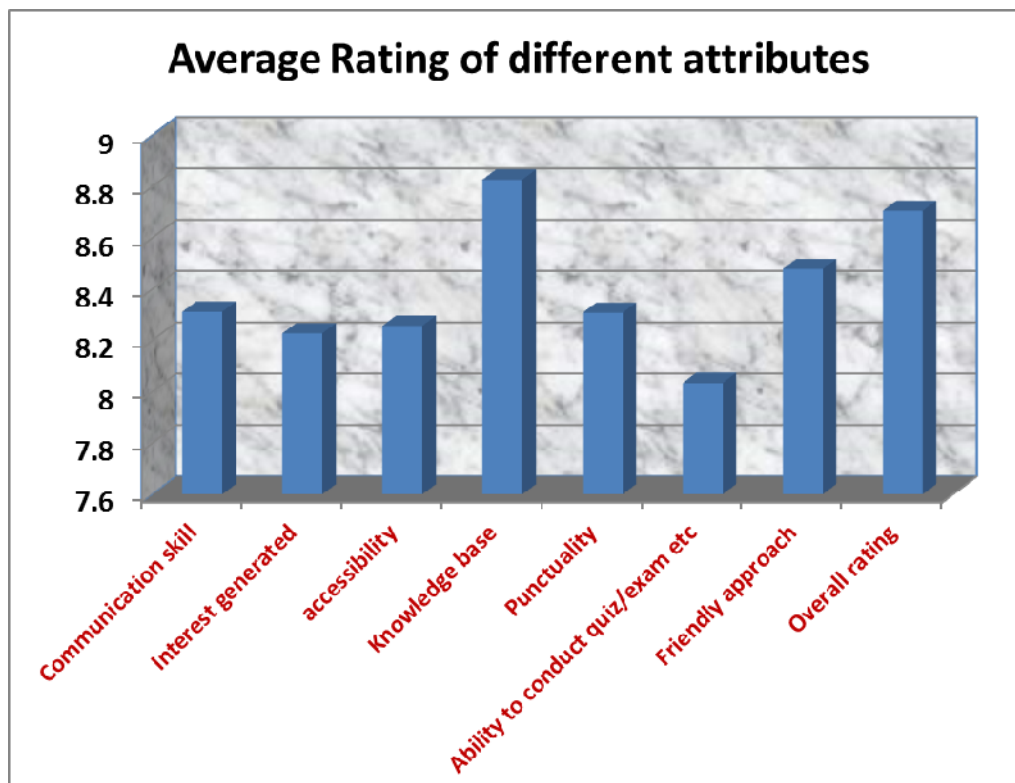
