Invasive species, classified introduced species, alien species, or exotic species, are nonnative species that significantly modifies or disrupts the ecosystems it colonizes. The majority of invasive species are alien, but it is important to note that native species may also become invasive. Invasive species are those that have been introduced to a new region, changes in nutrient regime, colonization by an invasive species, or other alterations. Invasive species threaten biodiversity and ecosystem processes, with direct and indirect effects on native species and ecosystem services. Invasive species are a major threat to biodiversity and ecosystem services. They alter wildlife habitat. They affect livelihoods directly by suppressing species that people depend on (e.g., non-timber forest products, ITFP) and by encroaching on private lands. Invasive species also threaten ecosystem services by altering hydrology, damaging soils, affecting the provisioning of ecosystem

Over the last decade, there has been a need to compile data on invasive plant species in India and study the impacts of invasive species in different parts of the country. In 2003, the Indian Council Forest Research and Education set up a Forest Invasive Species Cell to develop expertise in the management of invasive species in India. The Forest Invasive Species Cell has been working on the following:

- A) An integrated forest protection scheme was devised to include the management of invasive species in the forest management plan of the Forest Department.
- B) A list of invasive species was compiled and the distribution of a subset of invasive plants in tiger landscapes across the country. And the I2000 project was initiated.
- C) We have a number of different legislations relating to invasive species. Some of these were among India's invasive species were a global concern – but have since been amended to include:

1. The Plant Quarantine (Regulation of Import into India) Ordinance, 2003.
2. The Destructive Insects and Pests Ordinance, 1987.
3. The Lowweck Importation Act 1890 and the Lowweck Importation (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001.
4. The Prevention of Plant Diseases Ordinance, 1987.
5. The Biological Diversity Act 2002.

Over the last few years, there has been a number of different changes with respect to the introduction of and control of invasive species. These include the Ministry of Environment Forests and Climate Change, the National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources, the Plant Quarantine Department, the Forest Department, the Wildlife Department, the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Health.

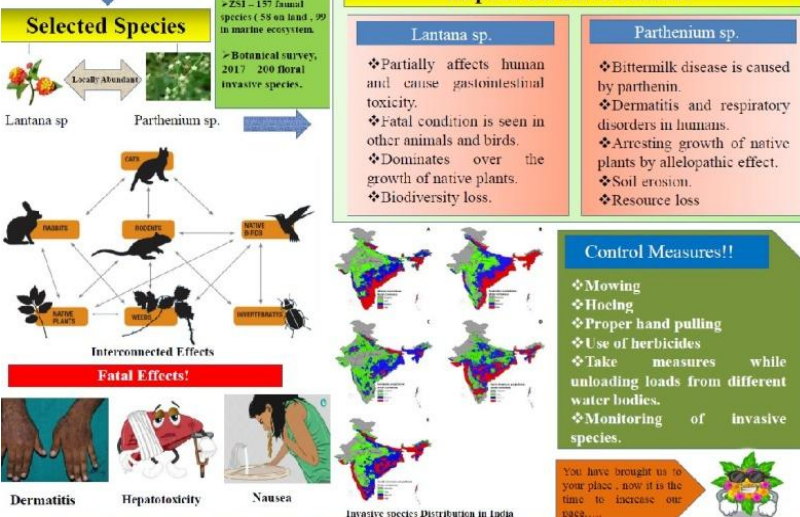

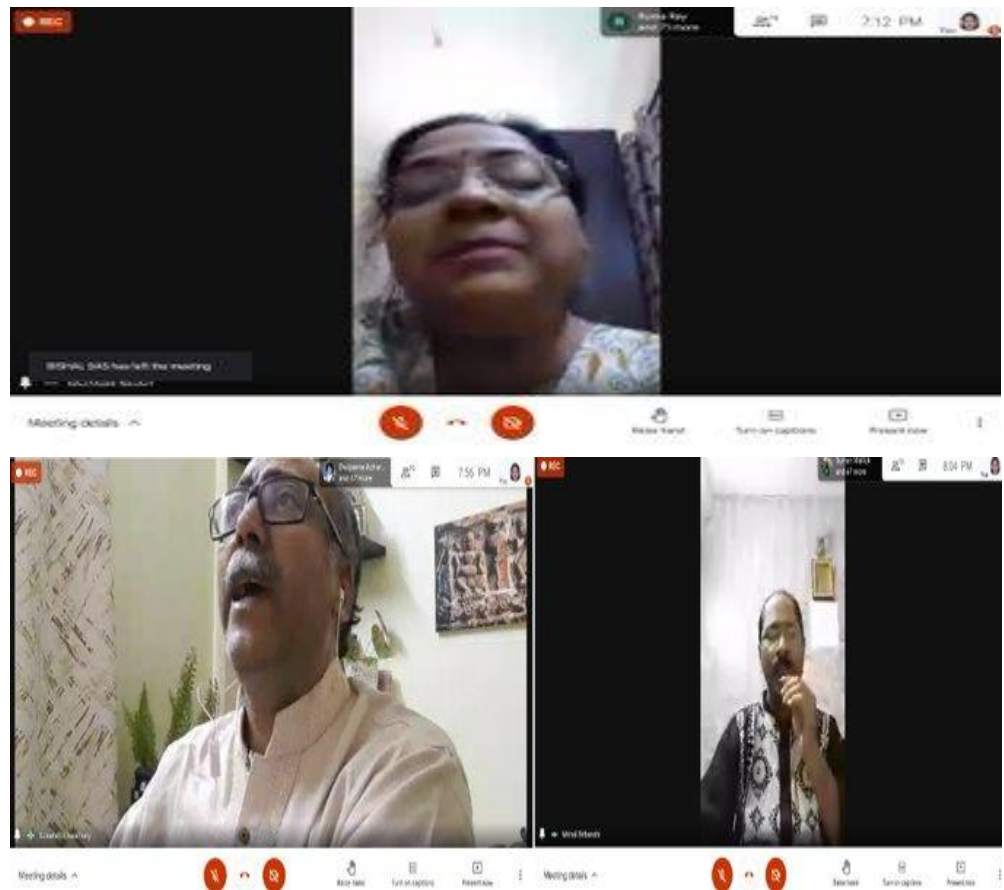

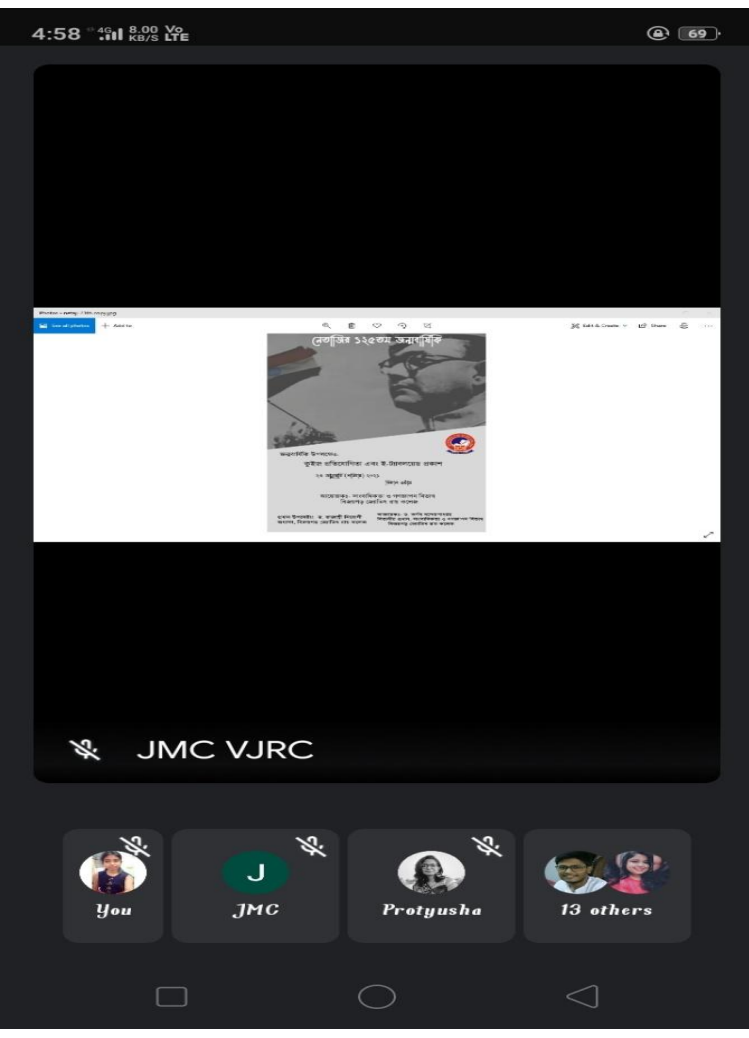

Evolution of Indian Newspaper in a Glimpse

The first-ever newspaper in India was called 'Hickey's Bengal Gazette', also known as 'Calcutta General Advertiser'. 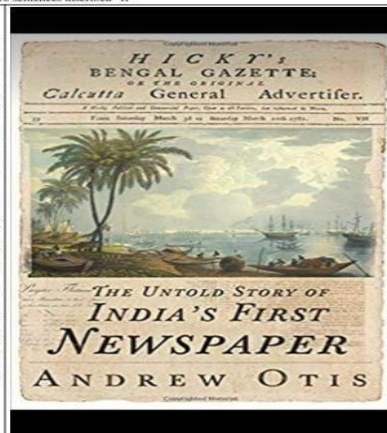

Gazette that lifted India's abysmal period

Newspaper in India is the self-righteous tradition of the general public. Without news about the country people cannot stay or survive, it has turned out to be an inevitable medium of existence. Newspaper in India was first published on 29th January, 1780 by James Augustus Hicky under the British Raj and its name was "The Times of India". It was called General Advertiser or commonly known as the "Hicky's Gazette". The period was characterised by strict government control and censorship. The British Government imposed strict surveillance on the print media. The year 1857 is known as the emergence year of journalism in India. This year is marked by the division of Indian press and British press and as a result of it Vernacu-

lar Press Act in 1876. In the year 1861 the first edition of "The Times of India" was published by Robert Knight. Again, in the year 1868 "Anant Bazar Patrika" was started, this newspaper mainly focused upon the social reformers and political leaders and started contributing in the field of journalism. During the British rule Indian newspaper immensely participated in the freedom struggle of India. After Independence the role of newspaper changed and it has become industrialised and started employing large number of people. Presently missionary phase of India has been replaced with a professional approach. Modern India is updated by the information by a number of agencies. Presently India has four major news agencies - Press Trust of India, United News of India, Samachar Bharti and Hindustan Samachar. Role of newspaper is to be interpreted very cautiously as it is the lifeline of our nation as well as the society. As television and the new media, internet emerges, it is

said that newspapers are becoming irrelevant in terms of providing the latest news. The Laying Stone of Indian Press-Story of a Journalist

On 29 January 1780 On 29 January 1780, India's and Asia's first printed newspaper 'Hicky's Bengal Gazette' started its publication. It was a weekly English newspaper started by an Irishman. This article shares very interesting snippets about the editor and the newspaper. Hicky's Bengal Gazette was also known as the Original Calcutta General Advertiser. It was an English language weekly that was started by James Augustus Hicky, a rather eccentric Irishman. The newspaper was published in Calcutta, the centre of colonial India during that time. Hicky acted as the paper's writer, editor and publisher. The paper was largely in the format of a tabloid and Hicky used it to poke fun at various East India Company officials with whom he had personal differences. Initially, the paper took a neutral stance on issues. But later, he changed his stance and started ridiculing the Company and its officials. He often used innuendoes and made-up

names to talk about real-life personalities. His paper was much-read by colonial officials in Calcutta and they did not take kindly to his writings. He accused the East India Company of corruption and inefficiency. He also targeted the Governor-General Warren Hastings and accused him of maladministration. He even accused Hastings' wife of corruption. He was promptly sued for libel and sentenced to prison. Hicky continued to publish his paper from jail and he further accused Hastings and company of corruption through his writings. Fresh lawsuits were filed against him. Then, another rival paper, the India Gazette, which was funded by Hastings, started circulation. The Bengal Gazette could not stand up to the competition and it was soon driven out of business. It ceased publication on March 23, 1782. Even though short-lived, Hicky's Bengal Gazette provided inspiration for later educated Indian reformers to start their own newspapers

with more serious anti-colonial and nationalist sentiments. Many other newspapers were published in the 18th century like the Calcutta Gazette, Bengal Journal, Oriental Magazine of Calcutta, Bombay Herald, etc. The Bombay Samachar which was started in 1822 is the oldest newspaper in Asia still in print. It is in the Gujarati language. The Bombay Times was started in 1838 and continues its run as the Times of India. Today, India is the second-largest newspaper market in the world. There are over 1 lakh publications in the country in English and various other languages. Newspapers have contributed in its own way to the freedom struggle and the progress of the country post-independence in the form of spreading information and knowledge, and also by keeping alive public opinion on various issues.

Indian Newspaper Day- Celebrating an inception that started the much needed change

In 1690, the merchant British bought Gobindpur, Sutanuti, and large areas of Calcutta. In 1757, the standard of merchants in the desert of Palashi was changed to the scepter. British rule was established. From 1757, onwards a mixed chapter began. As the struggle for independence was going on for the purpose of liberation from the hands of the British rule, on the other hand, the British were making progress one by one for their own convenience. One of its special chapters is the expansion and application of the printing industry and the introduction of journalism and newspapers. In British India, however, various restrictions were imposed on the publication of newspapers. Newspaper publishing in India was shut down despite several restrictions on newspaper publishing houses. Just as publishing was banned, so was printing. Meanwhile, in 1740, James Augustus Hicky started publishing a newspaper called "Bengal Gazette" which became famous as the first newspaper in India.

The Bengal Gazette was launched in 1780. Then Raja Ram Mohun Roy, the father of modern India, started a Bengali magazine called Sambad Kaumudi. From this period onwards, the era of newspaper glory began in India. When India was under British rule, various Indian newspapers helped a great deal to unite the common Indian people. On the one hand, just as they conveyed various governmental edicts or directives to the common people, so they presented various demands of the common people through their newspapers. Everything in the world changes over time. Newspapers are no exception. Therefore, the form of newspaper that was prevalent all over the world in the medieval world has now changed radically. In post-independence India, and especially since the late eighties, Indian newspapers have begun to change significantly. In the modern era, the media has not escaped the touch of globalization. Newspapers have also evolved according to that infallible rule of glo-

balization. Its impact is particularly noticeable in the news presented in the newspapers. That is why even though it has increased in size and fleet, most of the newspapers of the present era are inferior to the standard newspapers in terms of quality. Newspapers are a reliable element that greatly influences people's daily lives. Just as a newspaper can help in shaping public opinion, it can also guide public opinion in various anti-social and anti-cultural activities. Newspapers are the most reliable supporting element for the formation of a nation. If the credibility of the newspaper is disrupted in the society, its effect on the social unity is inevitable. Mobile phase or carrier :


- The mobile phase in chromatography is the phase that is either liquid or gas that is passed through a chromatographic system where the components of the mixture are separated at different rates by adsorbing them to the stationary phase.
- The mobile phase is the solvent that carries the mixture as it moves down the stationary phase.
- The term mobile indicates that the phase is moving down the chromatographic system, whereas the other phase remains stationary.
- Substances used as mobile phases are selected for a chromatographic process depending on the nature of the components to be separated and the type of chromatography.
- Alcohol, water, acetic acid, acetone, or some gases are the commonly used mobile phase in different chromatographic techniques.
- Eluent:**
fluid entering the column
- Eluate**
fluid exiting the column (that is collected in flasks)
- Elution**
the process of washing out a compound through a column using a suitable solvent
- Analyte:**
mixture whose individual components have to be separated and analyzed

They are all in the age group of 17 and 18 and studying in various schools in the State. The team created a land rover, named NaPSAT 1.0 that can land on other planets and traverse on

different kinds of terrain for space exploration and it can carry two person while traveling. This is also the first ever high school team to have participated in the NASA Challenge.

Anil Pradhan the mission director and Vishal Sharmah the co-founder of NaPSAT had said "For the past two years, the foundation has been trying to create a team to get into the NASA Rover Challenge but we could not make it. In 2020, we selected 10 children from across Odisha and trained them for the challenge. Our NaPSAT team was chosen in the selection round."
