Concept Note: The Asian countries especially the GANGA-MEGHNA-BRAMHAPUTRA (GMB) Plain of India and Bangladesh are the worst effected in the world. It appears the good portion of all states and countries in the GANGA-MEGHNA-BRAMHAPUTRA (GMB) Plain, compromising an area over mainly $569749km^2$ and a population over 500million may be at risk from ground water arsenic contamination. The source of Arsenic is mainly geogenic.

The arsenic contamination in lower Gangetic Plain leads to severe health hazards like skin diseases also lead to social problems like exclusions, untouchability and other such social taboos. Action is needed to sensitise the community of safe water and its use. Government agencies must create a framework for collective action with NGOs and CIVIL SOCIETY at large.
